In Loving Memory of Fr. Gerald Francis Todd, MHM: A Beacon of Faith and Education

On September 8, 2024, we gather in solemn remembrance of Fr. Gerald Francis Todd, MHM, a beloved figure in our community and a cherished former Principal. Born on February 12, 1935, in Nelson, Lancashire, England, Fr. Todd's life was marked by unwavering dedication to faith and education. His formative years at prestigious institutions like Freshfield, Burn Hall, and Roosendaal nurtured his love for learning and spirituality.

Fr. Todd entered St. Joseph's College, Mill Hill, in September 1956, taking his temporary oath in 1957 and his perpetual oath in 1959. His commitment to his vocation was sealed on July 10, 1960, when he was ordained by Anthony Denis Galvin, the Vicar Apostolic of Miri, in St.

















In 1963, Fr. Todd embarked on his mission to Freshford and Kashmir, embodying the spirit of service and humility. During this mission, he served as the Principal of St. Peter's High School in 1960 in Jammu and Kashmir, leaving a profound impact on the institution and its students. Despite facing health challenges later in life, which prevented his assignment to Rawalpindi, his legacy continued to inspire those around him. His contributions extended beyond borders, particularly through his work with vocations in the British Region during the 1970s.

Fr. Todd passed away on September 8, 1982, in Liverpool, leaving behind a legacy of kindness, wisdom, and faith. Though he may no longer be with us in body, his spirit continues to guide and inspire us. Let us honor his memory by upholding the values he so deeply cherished. May he rest in peace.
