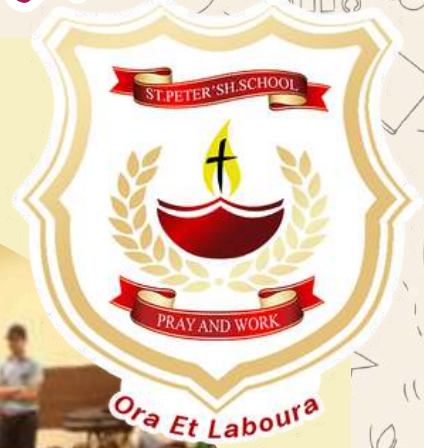

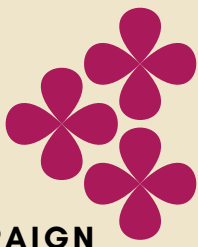

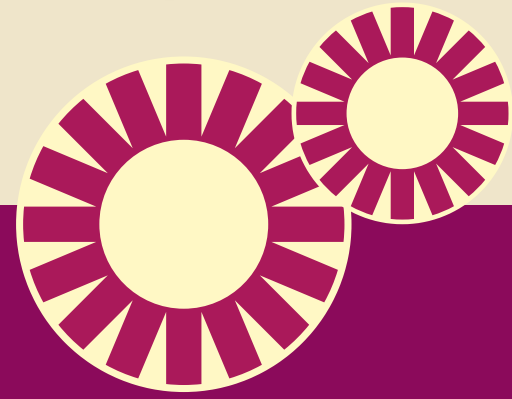
### EMPOWERING OUR YOUTH: JMC CONDUCTS "SAY NO TO DRUGS" CAMPAIGN

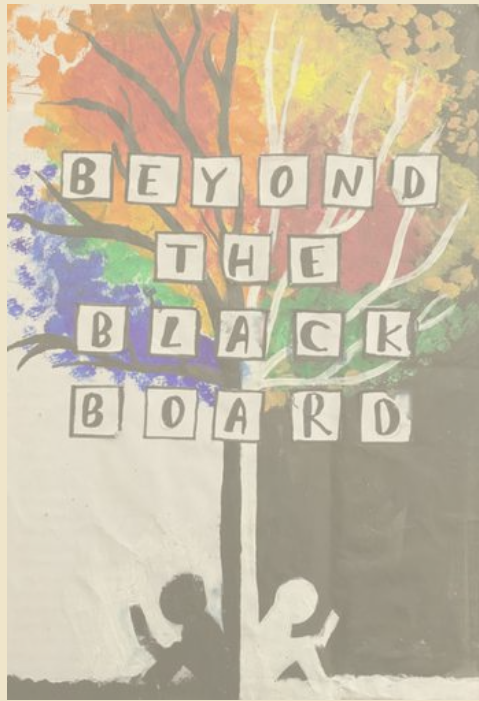

## WULAR LAKE RESTORATION: A MAJOR MILESTONE ACHIEVED

Massive recovery: 5 sq. km of Wular lake restored as 1.31 lakh trees removed. Jammu, April eleven: In a landmark achievement for environmental conservation in the union Territory, the Jammu and Kashmir government today announced the successful restoration of 5 square kilometers of the critically polluted Wular lake. This was made possible through the strategic removal of over 1.31 lakh willow trees, which had historically encroached upon the water body's capacity. Restoring the flood buffer, environmentalists are hailing this as a vital step in mitigation.



## NAINI LAKE: A SINKING LEGACY

It reports a detail a critical environment emergency at Uttarakhand's most famous water body. The sinking reflects not only to plummeting water levels but also to the structural and ecological decline of the entire lake basin. Naini lake has reached a 5 year low of 4.7 feet, a dangerous drop.



## SAMBHAR SALT LAKE: A DYING LEGACY

In December 2025, hundreds of dead fish washed ashore near the Mohanpur area, following a wave of migratory bird deaths in late October. A severe ecological emergency that threatens to turn India's largest inland saltwater lake into a barren wasteland. Experts confirm that over 185 migratory birds have died recently from symptoms identical.



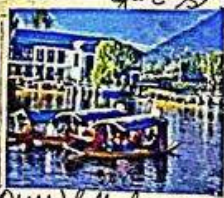
## CHILIKA WELCOMES 11 LAKH BIRDS: A RECORD-BREAKING MIGRATION

The shimmering waters of Chilika lake have transformed into a vibrant paradise as over 11.32 lakh migratory birds from 196 different species arrived for their annual winter stay. From the freezing lands of Siberia and the Caspian Sea, these winged guests have travelled thousands of miles to reach the Nalabara Birds Sanctuary, making this one of the most successful conservation years in the very rich history of Asia's largest brackish water lagoon.



## DAL LAKE SHRINKS 10%: ALARMING REPORT ON JEWEL

Srinagar's iconic Dal lake has lost over 10% of its open water area in just 13 years, according to a recent Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) report. The audit, released in April 2026, reveals that the lake's water spread (over) fell from 15.40 sq. km in 2013 to just 12.91 sq. km by 2020. This rapid shrinkage is primarily blamed on build up areas within & around the lake increased as population growth exceeded national averages. The "Road" (floating gardens) & agricultural fields in Srinagar.



## VEMBANAD'S TOXIC TIDE

Massive flow of untreated sewage and industrial waste have pushed heavy metal levels in the Vembanad lake to dangerous highs. This "toxic tide" is currently killing local fish populations and destroying the livelihoods of thousands of clam collectors who depend on the water for survival and for their future generations, chemical runoff & clean waste continue to suffocate the lake, the over thickening the biodiversity.

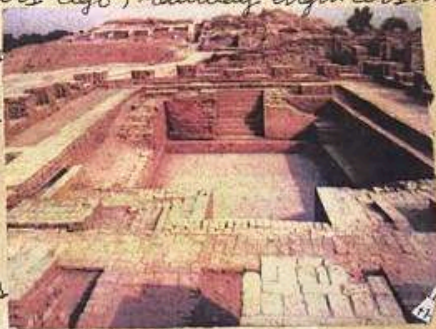

In a stunning revelation from our ancient past, archaeologists have unveiled the secrets of the Indus valley, specifically the legendary city of Harappa. 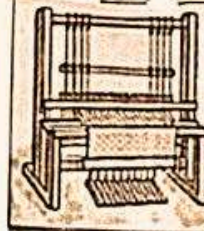

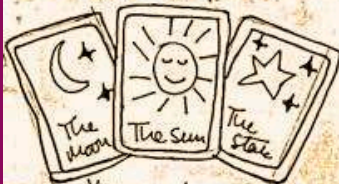

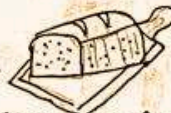

INGREDIENTS:

- 1+bsp post emclons
- 1+bsp cup milk
- 1+sp vanilla
- 1 slice bread
- 1/4 cup fruit
- 1/4 cup yogurt
- 1+sp nuts
- 1+sp honey
- 3/4 cup chia
- 3+bsp seeds
- 1/4 cup granola
- Salt to taste
- 1+spb savory
- Spices to taste



Instructions:-

- PREP:- Preheat oven to 350°F / 175°C. Line a loaf pan with parchment and lightly grease it.
- MIX DRY:- In a large bowl, whisk oats, baking powder, baking soda, salt and seeds.
- MIX WET:- In another bowl, mash bananas then stir in maple syrup, vanilla, melted coconut oil and egg until smooth.
- COMBINE:- Pour wet into dry. Fold gently until just mixed. Stir in chopped nuts.
- BAKE:- Pour batter into Pan. Top with extra seeds if you like

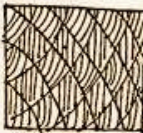

## SHUBMAN GILL TAKES ORANGE CAP LEAD WITH 251 RUNS:

Gujarat titans captain Shubman Gill has taken the lead in the IPL 2026 Orange Cap race after a match-winning performance against the Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR) on Friday night in Ahmedabad. Shubman Gill smashed 86 runs off 50 balls at the Narendra Modi stadium, earning the Player of the match award. He now has 251 runs from 4 matches, surpassing Virat Kohli for the top spot.

## VIRAT KOHLI GEARS UP FOR 100<sup>th</sup> MATCH AT CHINNASWAMY:

This headline refers to a historic milestone for Virat Kohli, who is set lead the Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) against Delhi Capitals at the M. Chinnaswamy stadium today April 18, 2026.

This fixture is especially significant as it marks RCB's 100<sup>th</sup> match at their iconic home ground. Virat is the most dominant batter in this stadium.



## SANJU SAMSON WINS ICC PLAYER OF MONTH:

Indian wicketkeeper-batter Sanju Samson was named the ICC Men's Player of the Month for March 2026 following his pivotal role

in India's successful T20 World Cup title defence. After starting the tournament on the bench, Samson delivered three consecutive match-winning innings in the knockout stages 97 against West Indies as a must-win super-85 Clash, 89 (42 balls) in the semi-final against England at Manchester Stadium.



## R. VAISHALI CLINCHES CANDIDATES TITLE:

Indian grandmaster R. Vaishali has made history by winning the FIDE Women's Candidates 2026 in Nicosia, Cyprus. This victory officially makes her the world championship challenger, earning her the right to play against the reigning champion Ju Wenjun for the world title. She is the first Indian woman ever to win the Candidates tournament.

## INDIA AND SOUTH KOREA STRENGTHEN TIES:

The headline refers to the landmark three day state visit of South Korean President Lee Jae-myung to New Delhi from April 19 to April 21, 2026. PM held extensive bilateral talks with the President Lee at Hyderabad.

## EXPANSION OF DIGITAL TIES:

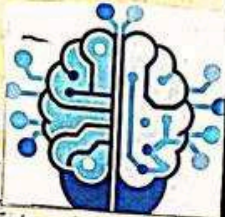
