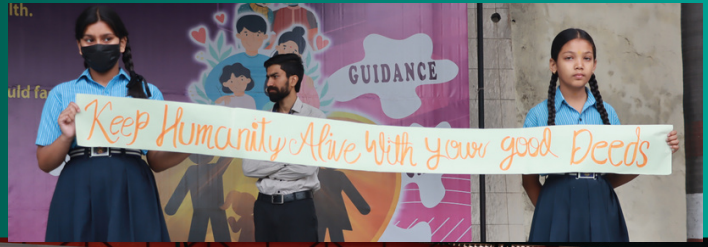
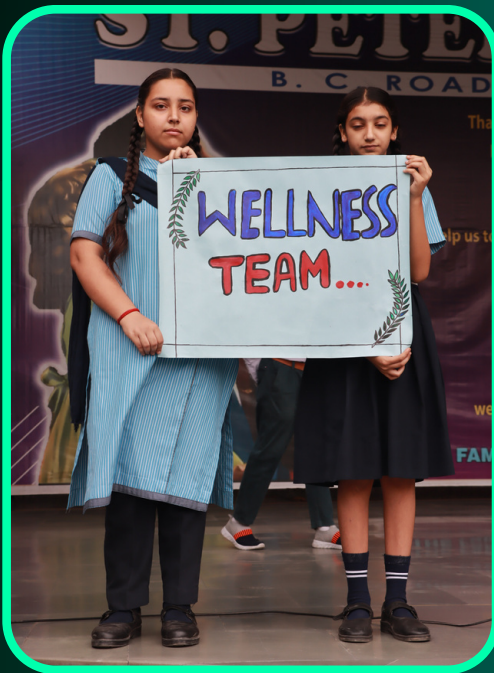
This day marks the anniversary of the signing of the first International Telegraph Convention and the creation of the International Telecommunication Union (ITU).

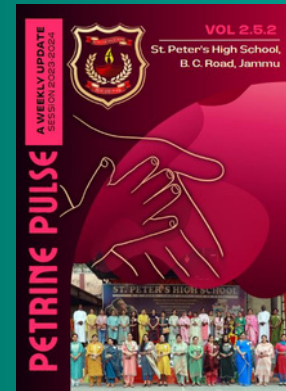

Soham Om Sharma, Avni, Simran and Mannat Malhotra have been given the Certificate of Participation in the SOF International Social Studies Olympiad.

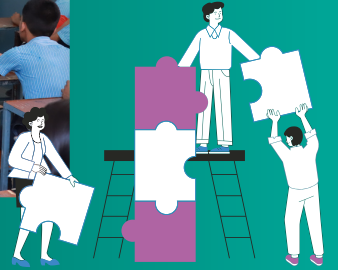
