- Whenever a faculty member enters your classroom, dear students, have the manners intact. Stand up and wish the faculty member. Teachers, kindly guide the students to wish the teachers or any faculty members who visit the classrooms.
- To those students, who were absent day-before-yesterday, and hence, have not yet submitted the general information form, submit the form with details of your address and WhatsApp number to your class teacher in the first period today itself.
- Sports uniform is mandatory and you have to wear it on every Saturday. Tomorrow is Saturday. You will have to wear sports uniform tomorrow. Students who have not purchased it, kindly purchase it today itself from the shop, either at Jewel or at Amphalla.
- Students are not allowed to come to school wearing expensive jewelry items, watches that are
  fancy and expensive; boys must have short, tidy and formal haircut, while girls with short hair shall
  wear black hair band and girls with normal and long hair will come with two plaits, using black
  rubber band and ribbons; nails should be properly trimmed, applying of nail paint or polish is not
  permitted; applying mehndi on palms and hands is not allowed; Abide by the rules of the school. All
  students must follow the student code of conduct.




